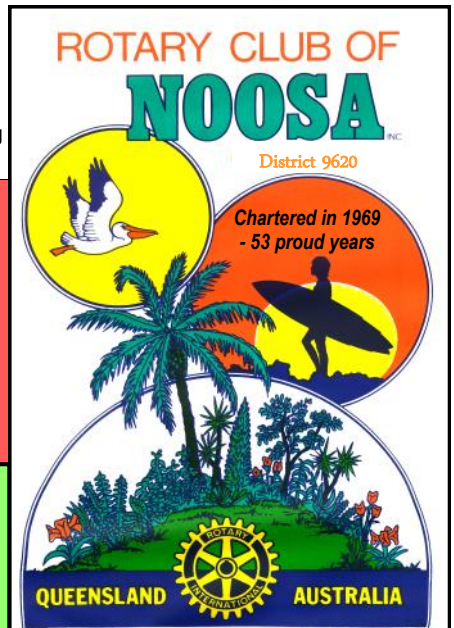

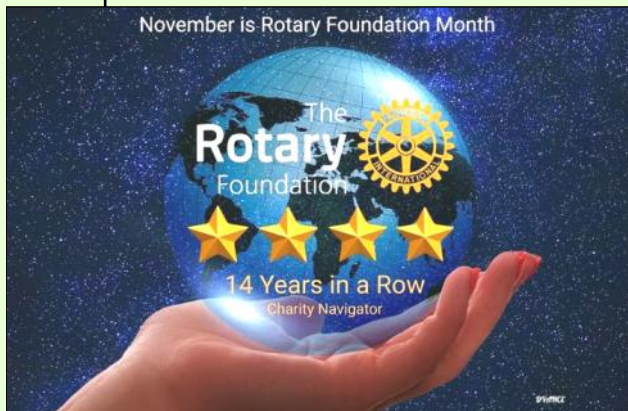
**Our mission:**
