Our last meeting was at capacity when we had Suzi Smeed, a survivor of the Hungarian holocaust, present her story of survival and hope. (pictured below with Treasurer Tess.)

This was a non-political story of history, one which should always be remembered so that it can never happen again.

Judging by the response we had on social media on the local community pages after the event, she is a very well liked and respected person in the community.

Treasurer Tess Alexandroff, presented Suzi with a Rotary Mug which I'm sure will remind Suzi of her time with Noosa Rotarians. **#**



Wikipedia defines the Holocaust in Hungary that Suzi spoke of as the dispossession, deportation, and systematic murder of more than half of the Hungarian Jews, primarily after the German occupation of Hungary in March 1944.

At the time of the German invasion, Hungary had a Jewish population of 825,000, the largest remaining in Europe, further swollen by Jews escaping from elsewhere to the relative safety of that country. The Hungarian Prime Minister Miklós Kállay had been reluctant to deport them fearing Hungary was trying to pursue peace with the Allies (which the diplomat László Veress secretly did in the September of 1943)

Adolf Hitler ordered the invasion. New restrictions against Jews were imposed soon after Germany occupied Hungary on the 19th. of March 1944.

The invading troops included a Sonderkommando which was led by SS officer Adolf Eichmann, who arrived in Budapest in order to supervise the deportation of the country's Jews to the Auschwitz concentration camp in occupied Poland.

Between 15 May and 9 July 1944, over 434,000 Jews were deported on 147 trains, most of them to Auschwitz, where about 80 percent were gassed on arrival. The quick progress of the deportations was enabled by close cooperation between the Hungarian & German authorities. **#**

On a happier note, Rotary through the Clubs in our local region, is focussing its gaze on a societal problem that is right under our noses, that of Family Domestic Violence. (or FDV or DV).

John Butterworth is a leader in that group and is passionate about bringing the problem to the notice of the general population so as we can promote education and remedial behaviour.
